- Become a lifeguard trainer instructor within 90 days of hire or possess lifeguard trainer at the time of hire.
- In cooperation with the Senior Director, Aquatics develop the annual operating objectives and monitor the achievement of these objectives. Exercise appropriate action to assure achievement of the objectives.
- Recruit, hire, train, supervise and evaluate lifeguard and teaching staff relative to program responsibilities. Assist with all appropriate staff trainings and meetings.
- Assist in the development and implementation of new Aquatic Programs.

What you need to succeed:

- A Bachelor's Degree and relevant experience.
- The candidate must have experience in organizing, promoting, and directing aquatic services.
- This position requires extensive skills in recruiting, training and direction of volunteer leaders and employees. The incumbent must possess skills in program development and fiscal. This position requires that the candidate must have the ability to make independent decisions that adhere to the purpose, mission, and goals of the YMCA. Effective human relations skills are critical to the success of this position.
- Must have current CPR/AED, and Lifeguard Certifications. Prefer or must obtain Swim Lessons Instructor Certification and Lifeguard trainer certification after hire. Previous YMCA aquatic experience preferred.
